**ITEM DESCRIPTION** - List/describe each item separately.

Example: If you are selling 10 Fat Quarters at an individual price, put each one on a separate line and describe it by colour or pattern, i.e. "Fat quarter - red dots". If selling as a bundle, list it as "Fat Quarter Bundle of 10 Batiks".

**SALE PRICE** - Indicate the price you wish to charge, keeping in mind that 10% will be contributed to the Guild.

Example: If you price an item at \$10 you will receive \$9 after the guild contribution.

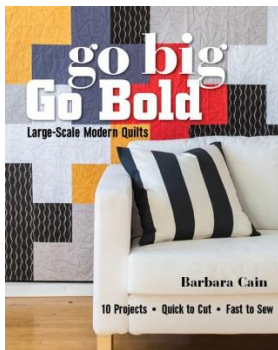
## Charity Quilts Update Leslie Whitby

## Interview with an artist

This month, it is my privilege to interview Georgia Beale.



I started quilting in 1976. I had always wanted to learn how to quilt because a neighbour quilted and I loved to watch her when I was about 10 years old.

I took a beginners course with Suzanne Elder through the Ottawa Board of Education in 1976. This gave me the basics. Over the years, I have taken many courses from well-known quilters, Jinny Byer, Maria McCormick Schneider, Judy Warren, Sheila Wintle, Ann Bird, Anna Hergert to name a few.

I particularly love hand quilting. It is such a meditative endeavor. No rush. Lots of thinking time. I usually quilt for about 2-3 hours every day although not recently due to physical limitations.

I wish I could tell you how many quilts I have made but I was never told I should keep track. I know I have made several hundred. I have pictures of most but not all.

This quilt was made to replace one for my son and his wife. The original one made with cottons was falling apart. I made the new one with polyester. It won't fade and won't shred.

I love scrap quilts and have made many. The Ottawa Valley Quilters Guild had a Scrap Club which met monthly for about 4 years. It was taught by Gwen Whitaker. I made every one she taught.

I mostly make bed quilts because I don't really like wall hangings.



I love whole cloth quilts. I have designed 5 patterns. I started designing my own whole cloth patterns because I didn't like the quality of the preprinted fabric that came with the design on it. The first pattern was an adaptation of an old pattern seen in a magazine. At the prodding of the original owner of The Running Stitch quilt shop, I had my patterns printed with instructions so they could be sold in shops. This venture lasted for a few years but I found that people don't want to mark their own quilts so sales were poor. The project died a peaceful death! I gave what was left of my pattern supply to the Poole Creek quilters. I still have the originals if anybody wants to borrow them.

This quilt is called Road to Burkholders. Got the pattern in Pennsylvania. I made 3 of these.

I have quilted quilts for many people. I prefer a low loft polyester quilt bat for hand quilting because it is light and the finished quilt falls nicely when on a bed. 80/20 bats are my second choice. 100% cotton - forget it. Too stiff and heavy for my liking.

I'm really not a teacher but any knowledge I have I'll happily share if asked.

This is a quilt I made for our eldest granddaughter when she had her 20th birthday. It is a Disappearing Four Patch. She chose the colours and the pattern. I had it machine quilted by Sara from the Country Quilter because there were so many seams.

Last year, I was fortunate to be awarded a prize for Excellence in Hand Quilting for my quilt Palmetto at the National Juried Show connected to Quilt Canada. I designed the pattern and did all the hand quilting myself.

The fabric is a very pale batik. I got tired of ecru. FYI 320 hours start to finish. The win was a total surprise. I decided to enter it at the last minute because there is so little hand quilting now. I had to take it off our bed, wash it and send it off when, to my surprise, it was accepted.



I've decided I should try machine quilting which I really dislike but, I figure, if I start with baby quilts for the Queensway Carleton Hospital, I may get to like it.



*The Queensway Carleton Hospital is requesting some items for their new ACE unit (Acute Care for the Elderly)  
- Keys, key chains, crayons, pencil crayons, bracelets and necklaces, small plastic flower pots. The recreational therapist can use these items in the unit.*

## Oh Canada!

**T**he Quilt for Canada was a collaboration between Canadians from coast to coast, *Canada Quilts* magazine and the National Capital Commission in Ottawa.

Early in 1990, Deborrah Sherman, the editor of *Canada Quilts* magazine in Hamilton, Ontario, had the idea of embarking on a special project to celebrate the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Canadian Confederation in 1992: a quilt made by Canadians from across the country.

A call for quilt blocks was launched through *Canada Quilts*. The blocks had to be 15cm square (6.5"). They could be made in any material that could be sewn. The design of the block should symbolize the participant's feelings as a Canadian. Contributors were encouraged to complement the block with a written explanation of each block's symbolism, which would be placed in a commemorative scrapbook.

The deadline for submissions was April 1, 1992.

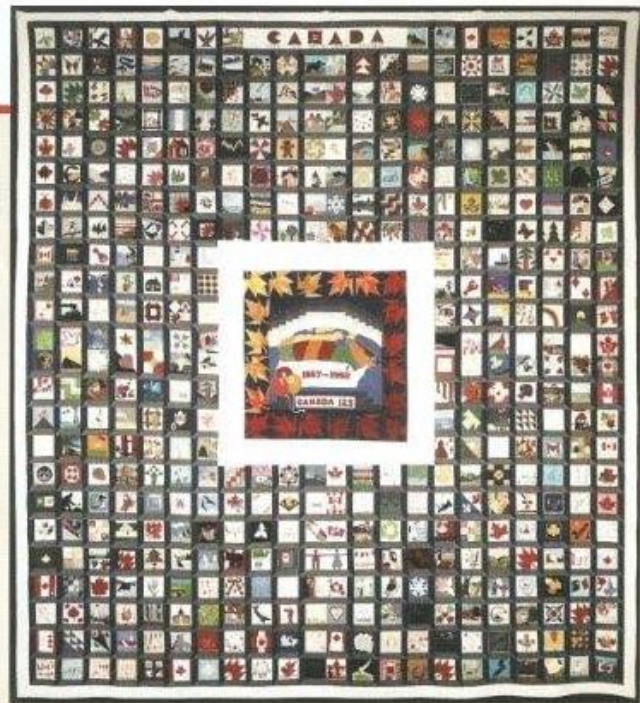
The contest for the central quilt panel, which could be as large as 1.5m x 2.1m was won by Kathleen Gaudaur of North Bay, Ontario. The quilt blocks were sewn into nine sections in Hamilton, Ontario, and the sections were sent to nine cities across the country to be quilted at public quilting bees.

One of the last of these bees was held at the 1992 conference of the Canadian Quilters' Association/Association canadienne de la courtoise in Thunder Bay, Ontario. The final assembly of the nine panels and final quilting was carried out by volunteers from the HAMILTON QUILTERS' GUILD.

The finished quilt is 4.6m x 5.2m and includes all 465 blocks received by the April 1, 1992, deadline.

In all, just over 3,000 Canadians, men, women, young and young at heart, contributed their hands and hearts to creating *The Quilt for Canada*. It represents a remarkable coming together of Canadians everywhere... a reflection of their feelings about our country and their hopes for the future.

*The Quilt for Canada* was unveiled in Ottawa on June 30, 1992 during the 125 Days of Celebration in Canada's capital region, which was organized by the National Capital Commission to mark the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Confederation. It remained on display in the capital until September 7, 1992, after which it toured sewing and quilting



festivals until December, 1992. Eaton's department stores displayed the quilt at their store locations throughout Canada during 1993.

After the quilt was finished touring, the National Capital Commission tried to find a permanent home for it with no success, so the quilt was handed back to Deborrah Sherman who had started the project.

For the last 23 years it has lived in her basement in the cedar-lined steamer trunk used to transport it across the country.

Since we are going to be celebrating the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Confederation in 2017, I thought we should try to have this quilt shown again. I had no idea where it was, but with the help of Judy Lyons, I found Deb and discovered that she has had the quilt for all the intervening years. With the help of the National Capital Commission, I'm going to try to have this magnificent quilt displayed again. Wish me luck!
