**Long Arm Quilter of the Month** - Quilt 4 U (Krista Zaleski) - I bought my first longarm in 2012. Until that time, I had quilted my own quilts on my domestic machine, but one quilt (a Bonnie Hunter mystery with 2" quarter square triangles and lots of string piecing) got the better of me. Half-way through, my shoulders were giving out and I went out and bought a longarm. And then, of course, a friend said "would you please ..." and another said "pretty please ...", and then gave my name to a friend. And before I knew it, I had a quilting business. In 2015 I retired from my high-tech job to quilt full time. And this year, I bought my second longarm. I do both custom and pantograph designs, and one of the machines is available for rental if you've ever wanted to try it out without the expense (or space) of owning your own machine. Now I quilt full time, and I've never had a job I enjoyed so much.

I have a number of small tops, and lots of blocks for making the same types of quilts as we made last year. I will have kits of backing and batting and binding ready for November 30 so we can get as many done as we can. Bring your sewing machine, and your walking foot, as well as your regular sewing supplies, and you will be bribed with coffee, goodies and chocolate!

Some people have asked to do another simple block from Missouri Star co. If you want to do this, please collect and bring a jelly roll or 32 to 40 2 1/2 strips and I will show you a fun new block - with no bias edges this year. I will do a short demo on how to put binding onto these quilts by machine which takes a fraction of the time of hand sewing.

We are also going to hold a Food Drive for the Kanata Food Cupboard, and socks, mitts and hats collection for the Shepherds of Good Hope, all at our December meeting. It would be a good idea to start collecting for these drives over the next few months, when it is not as busy as holiday time.

The quiltie sew day was a great success! Thank you to everyone who came out. We made 126 kits during the day, and made a significant dent in our fabric collection. Donations of fabric are always welcome - 100% cotton quilting fabric for the fronts, and flannel for the backings. We have received some batting donations recently, so we will have a small selection of batting available at upcoming meetings. Quilties need to have a layer of (non-polyester) batting - it's a great use for those scraps you have left over from larger quilts. But if you don't have any on hand, feel free to pick up a batt along with your quiltie kit.

### Big Quilt Bee Update

#### 2614 Quilts for Ronald McDonald Houses across Canada Meegwetch, Leslie

Success!! We did it! We reached our goal of 1,000 quilts for Ronald McDonald House Charities. In fact, we zoomed past that goal and made 2,614 fully completed quilts. This was the most incredible project that the Canadian Quilters' Association has ever done. We came together as a country of quilters and really did our best!

If you weren't there, it is hard to explain how VERY busy the Big Quilt Bee at Quilt Canada really was. But you can see and hear the hum on the CQA/ACC video posted on our Facebook Page and social media. There were about 90 volunteers - including people from our guild and region - helping over 4 days. As the quilts, tops and blocks poured in, two women from Ronald McDonald House Charities were accepting the quilts and talking to the quilters. They were completely overcome by the outpouring of love and the number of quilts from across Canada.

About 200 quilts were made during the Big Bee itself. If you were part of a Bee at your guild, you know how much work it would be to make 200 quilts in 4 days. There were well over 500 quilts shipped to local Ronald McDonald Houses directly from the Big Quilt Bee. The CQA/ACC Quilt Collectors across Canada had another 2,000 in their possession. They made the final deliveries to their local Ronald McDonald Houses over the summer. They have all indicated they will be happy when their living rooms are again available for family living.

We delivered 120 quilts to our Ottawa Ronald McDonald House in August. And we have another 100+ to deliver. As you can imagine, with the overwhelming response to the Big Quilt Bee, we were inundated with donations and we still have many quilts tops to finish. We offered to individuals, groups and guilds some of the unfinished quilt tops to finish and donate to either their local Ronald McDonald House Charity or a charity that they support. There are no deadlines so guilds can finish the tops on their own schedule. We have some of the donations for our guild and will use them for our charity day in November, as well as use some to practise your Quilting with a Walking Foot class in January. So far, these donations are going to Ronald McDonald Houses, Victoria's Quilts, Quilts of Valour, Meals on Wheels, Hospices, various community charities, and many to children in the Nunavut hospital. If you would like some donations for a charity that you support, please let me know.

I especially want to thank the members of the Kanata Quilt Guild who helped make the quilts but also organize all the donations for the Big Quilt Bee, opening mountains of mail and preparing items for the actual Bee. CQA/ACC could not have done such a great job without all the help you gave to this project. Look for lots more fun facts and figures about the Big Quilt Bee in the upcoming issue of the Canadian Quilter magazine. Thank you! Merci! Meegwetch! Thanks, Leslie

### Interview with Marianne Gibson



**How did you get started quilting?**

I started quilting in the early 80's. My sister in law quilted. I was looking at her books and was intrigued by the geometric shapes and the colours. I got hooked. I did take a beginners quilting course shortly thereafter and have been on the journey since then.

**What is your favourite type of quilt to make?**

I am more of a traditional quilter, squares, half square triangles and rectangles but love to do my own off the wall things too. "It's a Bad Hair Day" is an example. Since retiring I have had more time to quilt and therefore all my grandchildren are getting a second or third quilt. I do like to do scrap quilts because I cannot throw out those little pieces of material. Quilties are the answer to that. I liked doing hand applique but now am into fusing and machine applique.

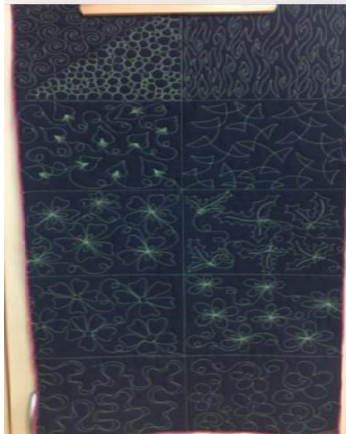
### Quilting with Walking Foot

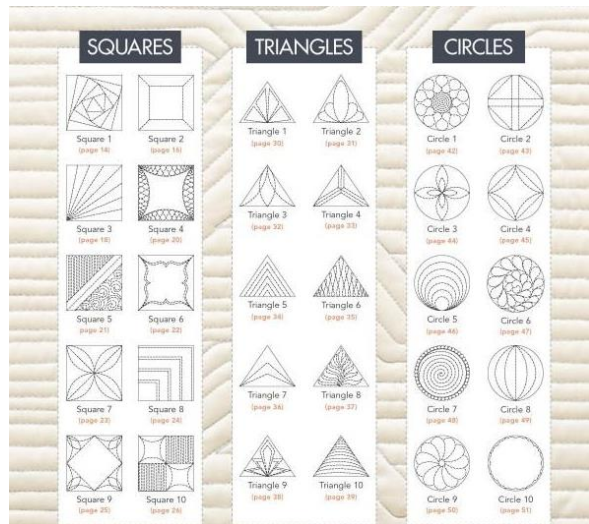
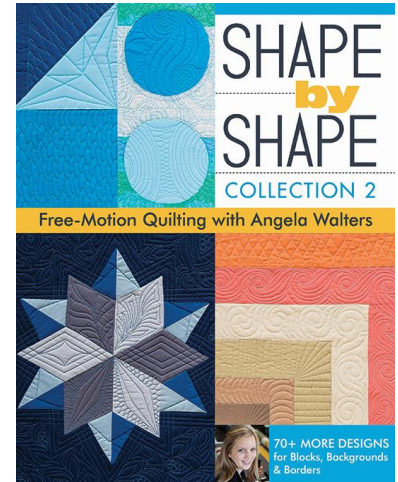
## Book Review Joanne Batchelor

## ATTENTION QUILTERS—

Dear Quilting Friends,

Allow me to share my exciting plans for 2018. I will be moving to Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia for a year to work as a volunteer on a Canadian government funded project.



While researching my new “home” I came across an NGO, Quilting Centre that helps unemployed Mongolian women learn sewing and quilting skills. The NGO’s mission is “to contribute to poverty reduction and to improve women’s livelihood in the suburban and rural communities through mobilization of the accumulated resources such as knowledge, skills, and creation of the workplaces.”

Many of you know that charity quilting and knitting is an important part of my life. Over the years I’ve been involved in making items for our soldiers returning home from various theaters, cancer patients going through treatments, people living in shelters, premature babies born in our hospitals, and other charities supported by the guilds I belong to. I intend to continue this work in Mongolia.

I need your help and support to cover some of the needs that Mongolian Quilting Centre has, and which we could easily fulfill - sewing and quilting tools, fabric and accessories.

**Here are some of the items you can donate:**

- ✦ fabric (FQs and yardage, specifically Christmas fabric to make items to sell and small scale prints to fit into their traditional designs),
- ✦ cutting tools,
- ✦ cutting mats,
- ✦ rulers,
- ✦ thread, etc.



In addition, money donations are very welcome to cover all shipping/duty cost of your donations to Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia, which is estimated to C\$500 minimum.
