### Victoria Quilts

Victoria Quilts Canada (VQC) are still in need of donations of any quilting fabric, except novelty or children's fabric, to make up their kits so that they can continue to make and deliver quilts to many more people this winter. Each month VQC makes and delivers about 540 quilts to people across Canada who are living with cancer, and some 220 of these quilts are made in the National Capital Region. ## Interview with Artist Michele Gagne Beth Cameron

I have been a sewer most of my life but earlier on did mostly home and garment sewing. It was when I was working for Kathy's Fabrics in Orleans and was their sewing machine expert that I started quilting. They were selling quilting fabric so the pressure was on for me to also learn quilting. I took my first class with Jill Gardner. I made my first quilt sampler in 1995 but I doubled the pattern to make it a queen size. Some sample!



I cannot begin to tell you how many courses I have taken. I lived in the USA for 8 years and took a lot of garment sewing and home décor courses there plus many here over the years. I have learned from many amazing teachers. I feel that many of the learned skills are transferrable from one type of sewing to another. All knowledge is good.

I think what I like best about quilting is the creativity I can put into my quilts. I also feel that quilts always bring warmth, both physically and psychologically. One other thing is that once you have completed a quilt and if you don't like it, you don't have to wear it like you might have to do with a garment.

My husband, Bernie Dumontier, has started cataloging my quilts for me and apparently, so far, I have made over 250 (the ones I can remember). When I do a trunk show I have many I can chose from! Sometimes that is the hard part deciding which ones to bring.

Since I have been in the Ottawa area we may have crossed paths as I have worked at the following stores, in chronological order:

- Orleans Sewing Centre (opened the store with Bertha Rowe) which became Quilty Pleasures (where I was a manager for 11 years)
- Operated a long arm service out of the Running Stitch for 5 years
- Now I am a home based.

I sew and longarm quilt in my beautifully set up home Studio. When I moved my business to my home I took over the basement and forced my husband out into the garage for his pastimes. I sew on several brands of machines and have 5 active machines all the time but suffice to say I like European machines best. I will not put in print how many machines I have in total!

I think if I had to pick a favourite type of quilt to make it would be scrap quilts ... with precision!

My experience has prompted me to develop a class for quilters to help them get better results with more precise sewing.



When I am writing this we are just getting over the holiday season. I took some 'me' time over the holidays and decided to concentrate on finishing some projects. I finished 4 bed size quilts and made 9 table runners (mostly for Christmas). It feels good but now I am moving onto some new projects.

I never work on just one project at a time and there are always ideas brewing on the back burner of projects to come. I do sometimes work with patterns but often use them as a guide and will add my own changes. I also develop patterns of my own, especially for the classes I have been teaching. I teach classes for local and out of the province guilds, stores, private classes and also taught at Quilt Canada.

Computer classes relating to sewing machines is also in my repertoire. Last year was a huge year for trunk shows as I presented 5 in eastern Ontario.

I have to admit I am probably what you might call a Retreat Princess! I really enjoy sewing retreats. I cannot call myself a Retreat Queen as I know a few who attend even more retreats yearly than I do.

I also belong to several sewing groups that meet weekly and monthly. I adore being with my quilting friends and the knowledge and laughs we share.

My favourite sewing gadget is probably the Bloc-Loc rulers. I do not know if I would have survived the making of the 365 days quilt challenge without it. I demo it in my Precision Sewing class if you are curious about it.

Speaking of the 365 quilt, I would have to tell you that it is probably my proudest quilting accomplishment to date.



- I learned to use fabric in a different way especially using colour value
- I learned the challenge and importance of precision sewing
- I learned that by breaking a huge project down into smaller pieces (daily blocks) it is not so intimidating (just don't set it aside for too many days)

It also enabled me to torment my friend, Beth Cameron, who was doing it with me - OK maybe I am a bit competitive about I think having a friend to do it with kept both of us going. So, I guess, I also learned the benefits of having a good quilting friend!

THANK YOU to 16 generous quilters for donating quilts to warm the lives of Syrian Refugees that have come to Canada and Ottawa to begin a new life

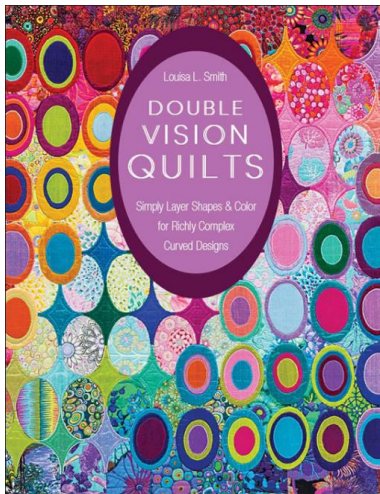
- 6 of the quilters belong to OVQG, 4 to Kanata Quilt Guild, 3 belong to both and 3 belong to neither.

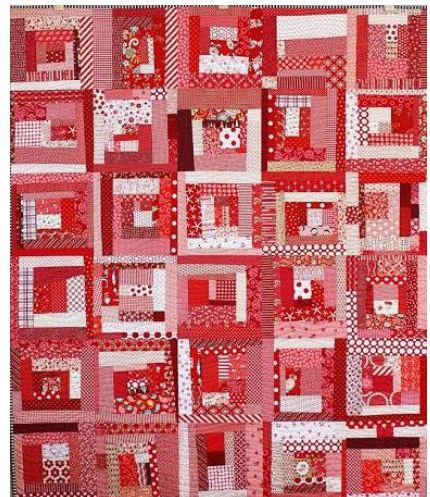

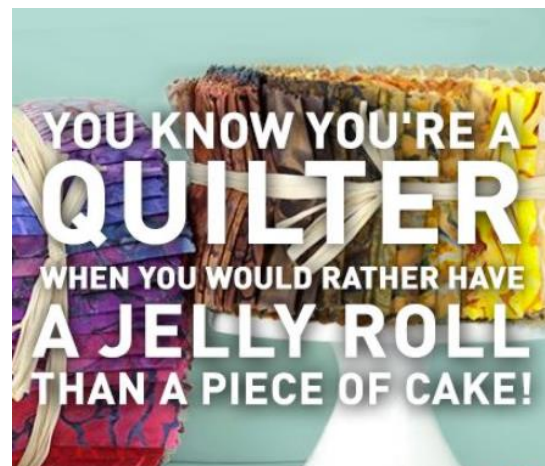
