Program - Whether it be traditional quilts which are hand quilted or machine quilted, the ladies from this inter-provincial quilting group take great pleasure in letting their creative juices flow. Many of the quilts for this bed turning have not been shown before, included also are special group challenge quilts. Together these Quilters add up to more than 400 years of experience. It truly will be an old fashion bed turning event.

Shop of the Month - Phyllis Home Decor Quilting for the home, has taken years to evolve to what it is today. I have been quilting for more than 27 years. I started sewing for decorators when the kids were young. When we moved into our current home my husband suggested that I should get a longarm quilting machine so I did. Long Arm - Sarah Jane Smiley, 'Heritage Art'. Sarah Jane started to develop an interest in fabric art in the late 90's when she moved from New Zealand to Canada with her husband. However, it wasn't until 2002 with a newly born baby and time at home that she finally signed up for a beginner quilt class and discovered a creative side she didn't know she had. After beginner quilts, place-mats, many straight line quilting adventures and some time spent getting to know her seam ripper! She ventured into free-motion quilting on her domestic machine. In 2013, she became acquainted with the longarm quilting machine at The Country Quilter —and a new passion was born. A whole new world of possibilities opened up, and it was later that year she began longarm quilting for customers. She enjoys the diversity of art that comes into her studio - the traditional, the modern, the experienced quilters and the beginner quilters; all of it. Her work is hand-guided, and she loves to quilt both pantographs and custom designs. Her business, Heritage Art, is located in the upstairs of The Country Quilter in Richmond. She is available by appointment.
