

PEEK IN THE TINY WINDOW

Use three different fabrics of your choice creating a monochrome look. For example, you could use three different blues, or three different greens, or three greys and so on. All seams are $1\frac{1}{4}$ inch. Vertical seams are pressed to the right of the square and horizontal seams are pressed towards the bottom of the square

Cut the following:

Fabric 1

1 – $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch square

Fabric 2

2 – $2\frac{1}{2}$ X $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch squares

2 – $2\frac{1}{2}$ X $6\frac{1}{2}$ inch rectangles

Fabric 3

2 – $2\frac{1}{2}$ X $6\frac{1}{2}$ inch rectangles

2 – $2\frac{1}{2}$ X $10\frac{1}{2}$ inch rectangles

NOTE: Use three different fabrics of your choice creating a monochrome look. For example, you could use three different blues, or three different greens and so on. All seams are $\frac{1}{4}$ inch. Vertical seams are pressed to the right of the square and horizontal seams are pressed towards the bottom of the square

ASSEMBLY

Fabric 1 – use that $2\frac{1}{2}$ X $2\frac{1}{2}$ square for the centre of the block

Fabric 2 – sew $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch squares to the left and the right of central square 1

sew a $2\frac{1}{2}$ X $6\frac{1}{2}$ rectangle above and below the strip with square 1

Fabric 3 – sew a $2\frac{1}{2}$ X $6\frac{1}{2}$ inch rectangle above and below Fabric 2

Sew a $2\frac{1}{2}$ X $10\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip on both sides of the block
