#### **Chris Allaway**



Chris enjoys spending time with nature, whether it's hiking in the Georgian Bay area or in Banff and British Columbia, or just relaxing outdoors. It was not until working with fabric while learning to quilt, that she discovered she could create realistic scenes using small pieces of fabric. Chris has been working with fabric for approximately 10 years now, starting with small wall hangings and gradually teaching herself how to create realistic landscape art. When viewed from a distance Chris' art looks like a painting, people are encouraged to come closer to see that it is done with fabric. Most people are amazed when they realize it is all done with small pieces of fabric that are carefully layered, stitched, and stretched on canvas. While there are several textile artists in the area Chris' art is still considered unique in the way that it is done.

#### **News from Kemptville Quilters' Guild**

New book - Quilts of North Grenville & Area 2023

In May 2023 volunteers from Kemptville Quilters' Guild and North Grenville Historical Society undertook the documentation of 127 quilts as part of the Eastern Ontario Quilt Documentation Project. Quilting history captures not only the finished work but the stories of the people who made the quilt and the reason that the quilt was made. These stories are local stories, family stories and stories that might be lost to the future if they are not written down now by the people who know them. A book with these stories and a colour photograph of each quilt is now available. This book will be of interest to both quilters and to history enthusiasts.

The National Juried Show will take place at Quilt Canada 2024, June 19-22, Edmonton Convention Center, Edmonton, Alberta.

Entries for this show will be accepted beginning January 3, 2024 and will close as of February 16, 2024 at 12:00 p.m. (noon).

This year there are two new categories which are:

PATTERNS/BOOKS/MAGAZINES or SOCIAL MEDIA – WALL HANGINGS – Entry may be a Traditional, Contemporary or Modern design that uses a published pattern or a combination of original elements along with blocks or elements of published patterns. Maximum perimeter of 300".

PATTERNS/BOOKS/MAGAZINES or SOCIAL MEDIA – BED QUILTS – Entry may be a Traditional, Contemporary or Modern design that uses a published pattern or a combination of original elements along with blocks or elements of published patterns.

All the other information regarding Categories, Entry Procedure, Requirements and Rules, Photography, etc. are to be found on the CQA website.
